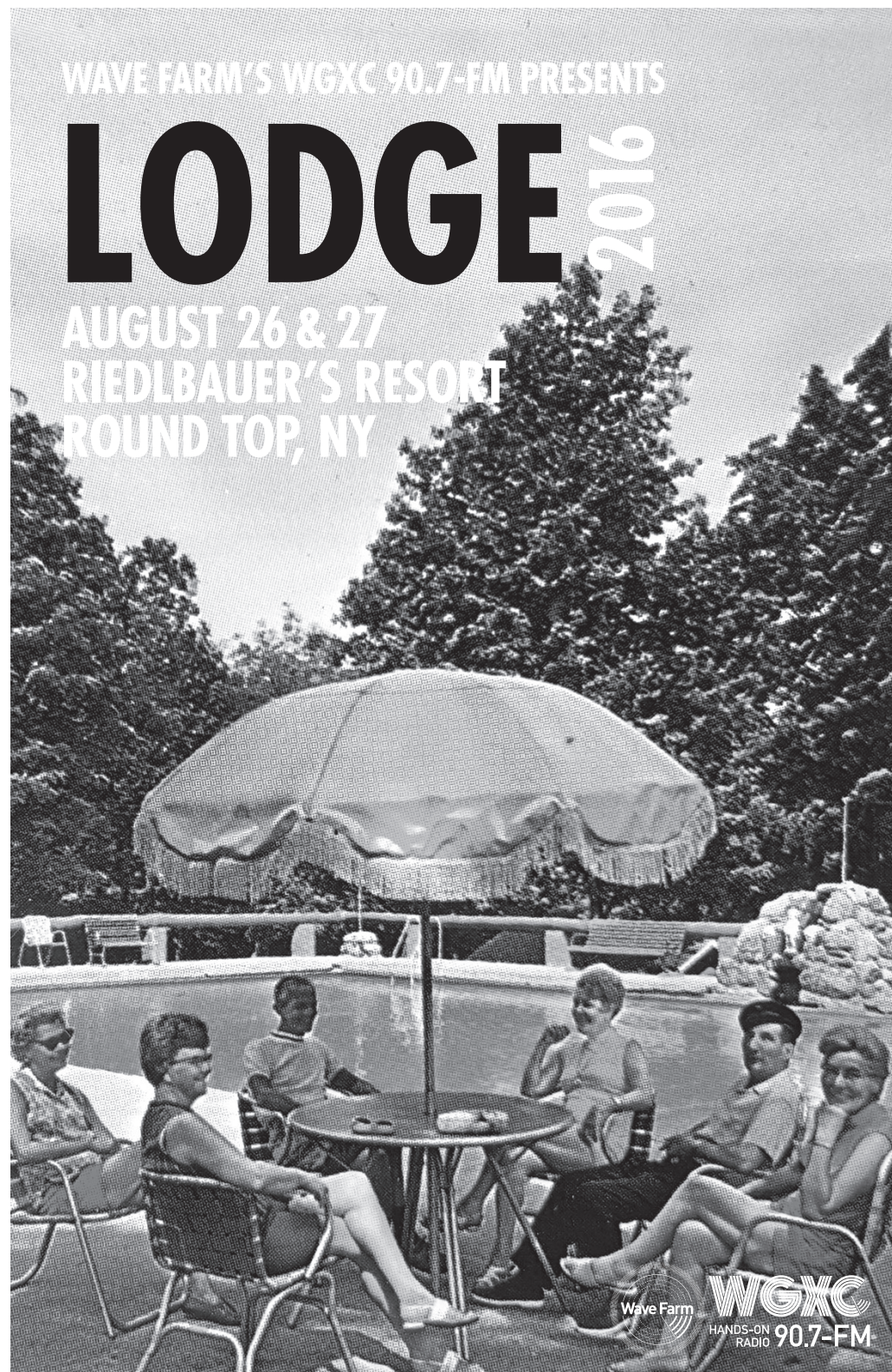
## About RIEDLBAUER’S RESORT

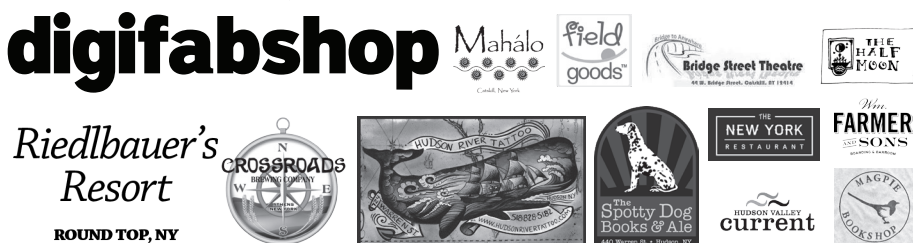

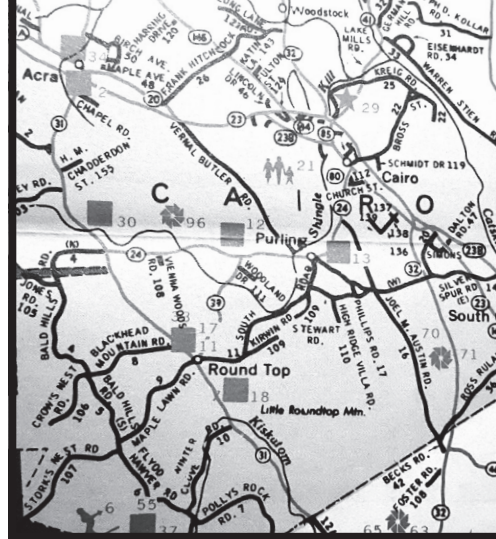
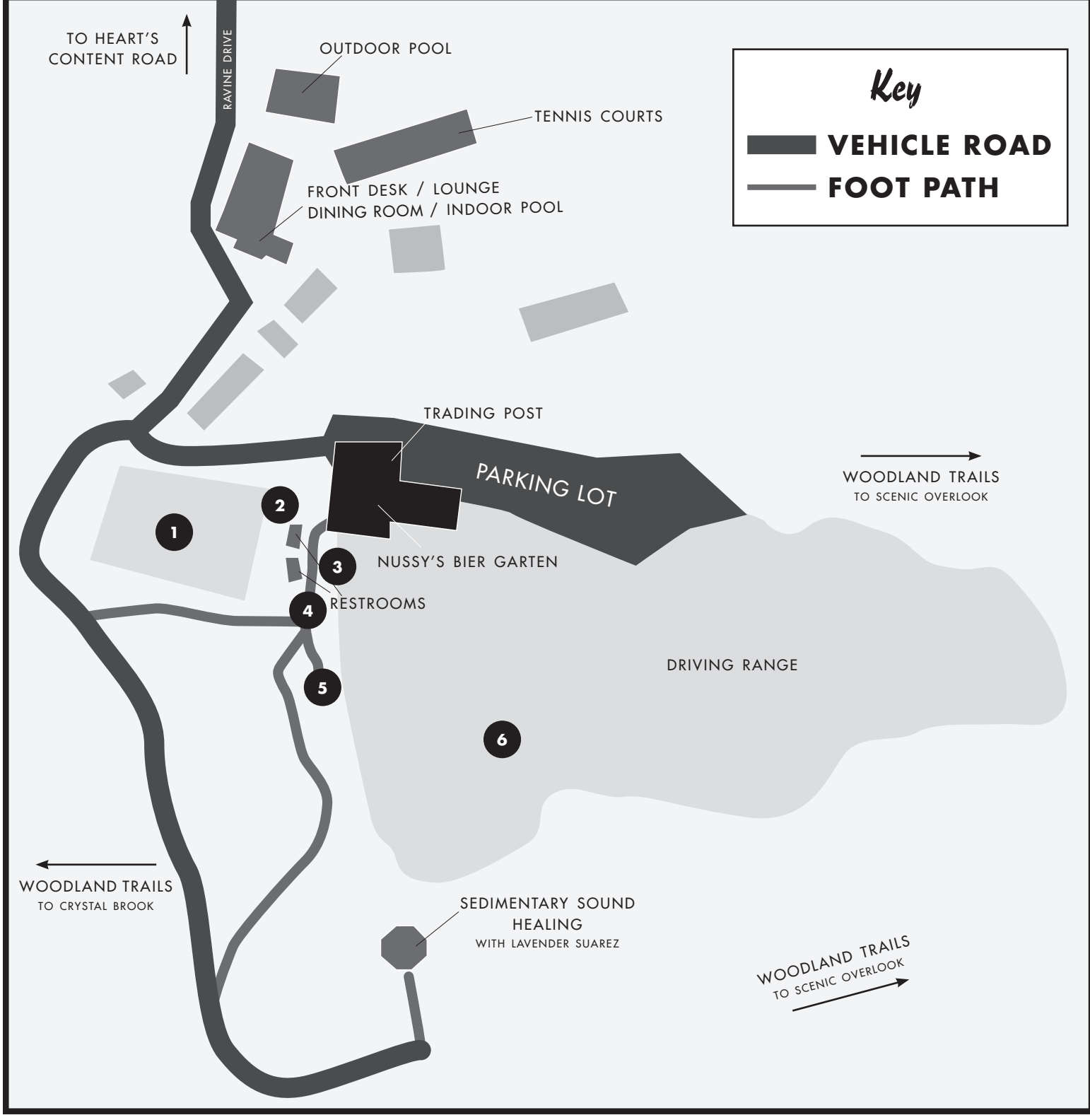

“I SHALL NEVER FORGET MY FIRST VIEW of these mountains. It was in the course of a voyage up the Hudson . . . before steamboats and railroads had driven all poetry and romance out of travel. We were all day on the sloop, slowly tiding along. Of all the scenery of the Hudson, the Kaatskill Mountains had the most witching effect on my boyish imagination. Never shall I forget the effect upon me of the first view of them predominating over a wide extent of the country, part wild, woody, and rugged; part softened away into all the graces of cultivation. ## Artists & Installations ...

A NEW ADDITION TO LODGE 2016: A SERIES OF INSTALLATIONS ACROSS GROUNDS OF Riedlbauer’s, on view all day and into night on Saturday, August 27. Diverse artists have created works unified by both a respect of the natural environment, and also a willingness to mold it. The recreative landscape of Riedlbauer’s is interrupted by a jarring site: televisions aglow amongst the foliage. Nearby, a nondescript wooden box waits quietly, unsettling those who handle it with urgent vibrations—a warning? Katydid songs mingle with the chirps and whistles of shortwave radio in a survivalist tent, thereby casting radio as an element of the natural world. Elsewhere, a decommissioned hot air balloon receives a whimsical second life, duplicating and enhancing the surrounding forest canopy. As night falls, a glowing rhapsody of fire and water emerges from a field, beckoning concert-goers to observe, moths to its flame.

### 1. A NEW KIND OF SHIP ... CAITI HAWKINS

In this large-scale temporary awning, a retired hot air balloon is given new life, an effort to shade the un-shaded. Caiti Hawkins is an artist and designer, whose work includes set and costume design, floral arrangement, sculpture, and installation.

### 2. UNIT 11 ... VICTORIA KEDDIE

*Unit 11* is a mobile residency that focuses on transmission-based research and practice. The residency, named after its former ID tag for Austin Channel 8 News, is a studio-on-wheels that engages in site-specific transmission-based projects with other artists, technological innovators, scientists, and engineers. *Unit 11* has been fully outfitted for live video mixing and broadcast using both analog and digital media. At *Lodge*, the van will be “on” with *Unit 11* director Victoria Keddie, demonstrating the technology that outfits the mobile studio. All are welcome to explore, engage, and experiment.

### 3. SMALL SURFACE PATTERNS ... KOEN HOLTkamp

*Small Surface Patterns* is single-channel installation in which vibration is composed from inaudible low frequency sine waves. The composition is played inside a small wooden box, designed to be handled by viewers. Emerging from silence, pre-composed vibrations gradually intensify into interference patterns. Kinetic energy is transferred through the hands of participants, creating a dynamic sense of movement and states ranging from meditative contemplation to anxiety. Koen Holtkamp is an artist and composer currently based in Brooklyn. His current investigations include a series of objects and installations focused on composing for vibration and light, as well as using electronics to resonate acoustic objects.

### 4. FEVER MOON ... CATSKILL MAKER SYNDICATE

Guide moonwalking avatar Michael Jackson in this interactive video installa-

tion, spread over an array of CRTs nestled amongst boulders and trees. *Fever Moon* considers the intersection of iconic celebrity, sexual identity, and the techno-solipsist “new normal” by subverting consumer technologies to challenge the conceits of the culture they are intended to disseminate. The Catskill Maker Syndicate is a Catskill-based collective of makers and artists, whose core members include Bryan Lauas, Mollie Dash, Albert Flores, and Code E.

### 5. INTERSPECIES RADIO SHACK ... BRYAN ZIMMERMAN

*Interspecies Radio Shack* is a rustic lounge which mixes the sounds and imagery of amateur radio with those of the natural world. Audio elements include field recordings of singing insects, birds, frogs, water, leaves, rain, and live amateur radio transmissions captured by Zimmerman’s father, John J. Zimmerman—a lifelong amateur radio operator. The walls of the structure feature photograms, ink renderings, and amateur radio ephemera adapted from QSL cards. Zimmerman’s interdisciplinary work draws from relationships with nature, place, and the outdoors. His unconventional approach to materials and social space routinely integrates audio and visual collage. He was a Wave Farm artist-in-residence in May, 2016; numerous field recordings and images herein were created nearby in nearby Acra, while he was in residency.

### 6. IPSUM TERRA ... ELIZABETH SCIORE-JONES

*Ipsum Terra* is a video sequence of water, fire and nature, looping with ascending complexity from sunset to midnight. *Ipsum Terra*—literally, “the earth itself”—explores the organic movements contained in the classic elements of the earth as an microcosmic rendition of the origin and action of all life. Elizabeth J. Sciore-Jones is an MFA Candidate at the Herron School of Art and Design in Indianapolis, IN. Her art questions the underlying origins of the universe, and humanity’s role within it.
