The Wave Farm Residency Program provides artists with a valuable opportunity to concentrate on new transmission works and conduct research about the genre using the Wave Farm Study Center resource library. Employing the electromagnetic spectrum, Transmission Art encompasses work in participatory live art or time-based art such as radio, video, light, installation, and performance, as well as a multiplicity of other practices and media, informed by an intentional use of space (often the airwaves). Resident artists visit for ten days between June and October and receive an artist fee of \$700. In conjunction with their residencies, artists perform, are interviewed, and create playlists for broadcast on Wave Farm's WGXC 90.7-FM, a creative community radio station serving over 78,000 potential listeners in New York's Upper Hudson Valley, and international listeners online.

January Deadlines for Artists and Orgs Up to \$10,000 available to New York State artists to distribute or exhibit a recent media artwork

New York State Council on the Arts in Partnership with Wave Farm: Media Arts Assistance Fund for individual artists with support for the Distribution of a recently completed work in all genres of time-based and moving image media, including emergent technology. Distribution Grants enable new work to reach public audiences and advance public engagement in the media arts.

Up to \$4,000 available to New York State organizations to hire outside consultants for development work.

The New York State Council on the Arts in Partnership with Wave Farm: Media Arts Assistance Fund (MAAF) provides funds to hire outside consultants to support organizational and professional development, as well as convening and conference attendance. Eligible organizations have missions specific to the media arts, and dedicate the majority of their programming to technology as an art form. Applications from multi-disciplinary organizations will be considered on a case-by-case basis, but are not a MAAF priority.




